Times are a'changing at Hoopeston American Legion

There's a new feel to a long-time organization in Hoopeston.

The Hoopeston American Legion has added new activities in an effort to boost membership.

"We decided that a lot of area Legions are closing down because younger people are not active," said club manager Liz Witty. "We decided to try some new things to see if we can get more people involved."

Two main ways of attracting new people have been used: food and fun.

A Monday spaghetti night was tried and discontinued, but a Tuesday taco night "is going very well," Witty said.

During the summer months, Legion officials plan outdoor barbeques.

The first one is scheduled Friday night and will feature grilled pork chops and chicken breasts with side dishes.

On the fun side, the club has offered free pool on Mondays and Tuesdays and a monthly pool tournament.

Top prize for the double elimination, 16-player tournaments, held April 25 and May 30, was \$100, Witty said, with a second prize of \$50.

New tunes are also offered, on a new juke box at

the club. "The man who installed it told us we have one of the best juke boxes in the area," Witty said.

Music ranges from 50s and 60s to classic rock to country to dance music, she said.

Although not scheduled yet, Witty said there are plans for a bus trip to either a Cubs game or riverboat gambling.

While several new activities have been added. some old favorites remain.

The Legion will continue its monthly dances, along with other activities, such as Thursday night bingo and Wednesday night euchre.




