## Hoopeston to host first local white goods collection days

Your old air conditioner just conked out in this heat. You bought a new one to replace it, but what do you do with the old one?

Your options are limited. You could make it into a low end table or a piece of modern art. The one thing you can't do with it, though, is take it to the landfill.

Hoopeston city officials have a better idea.

Your old air conditioner, along with stoves, microwave ovens, washing machines, dryers, refrigerators, freezers and furnaces can be taken to the first Hoopeston White Goods Drop Off Days this Friday and Saturday.

Used appliances will be accepted at the city slab on Route 1 between 7 a.m. and 3 p.m. Friday and 7 a.m. and noon Saturday, said Mayor Bob Ault.

Freon should not be removed from refrigerators,

freezers and air conditioners.

There is no cost to residents to take appliances to the slab, Ault said, adding city workers will be at the site to help unload, if necessary.

The program is being sponsored as a convenience to residents. "It's strictly for accommodation to help people who might have white goods," Ault said. "It's part of an all-out effort trying to clean up the town."

The collection is part of a county-wide white goods drop off program sponsored by the Vermilion County Recycling Program.

The county program is being held June 16-30 with collection points at Coultas Recycling, 123 N. Second St., Danville, and Mervis Iron & Metal, 2313 Cannon St., also in Danville.

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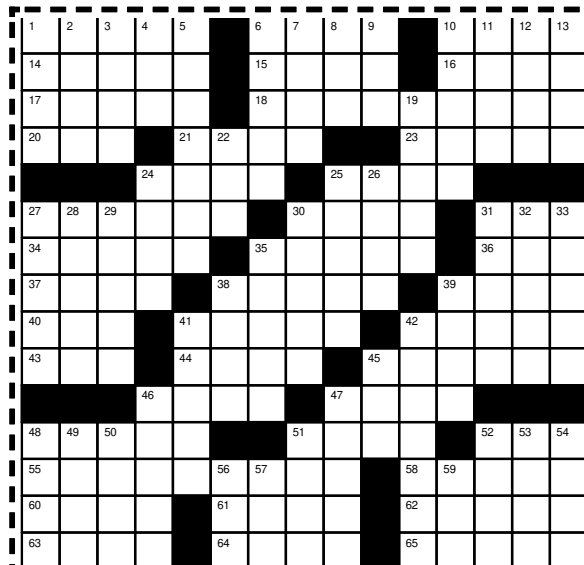
