City officials approve applying for second housing rehab grant

Hoopeston officials hope to cash in on state money to fix homes on the city's northeast side.

At Tuesday's council meeting, aldermen unanimously approved applying for two housing rehabilitation grants.

The city is applying for \$230,000 from the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs and \$50,000 from the Illinois Housing Development Authority, said Scott Rose, housing program manager for the Champaign County Regional Planning Commission.

Rose has been hired by the city the last two years to fill out housing grant applications.

If the city receives the full amount, approximately 15 homes will receive an average of \$17,000 in repairs, Rose said.

Repairs concentrated in three areas: health and safety, weatherization/energy conservation, and general property improvements, Rose said.

The first area includes structural and roof work, as

well as electrical, plumbing and heating repairs. The second phase includes insulation, windows and doors, and the third area consists of siding, soffit and facia work, Rose said.

This is the second time the city has applied for housing rehabilitation money.

In 1995, the city received approximately \$300,000 which was used for 18 projects. The last two projects are currently going out for bid, Rose said.

The city has targeted the northeast side as the area to be served under the program. Residents in the area interested in participating may call city hall at 283-5833 or Rose at (217) 328-3313, ext. 138.

Whether the city receives grant money will depend, in part, on public support for the program, based on the number of applications received.

State officials will consider other factors, including the percentage of residents living at or below the poverty level, unemployment and minority population levels,
