High temperatures send two to hospital, others to local stores

Temperatures in the 90s, combined with humidity - and a heat index in the triple digits - had local residents scurrying to find a cool spot.

Two people were treated at Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital for heat-induced conditions, said Sandi Thompson, emergency room nurse manager.

A man was brought in by ambulance Saturday night, she said, and a young woman was treated Sunday for illnesses stemming from the heat.

Although temperatures have cooled, Thompson said people must be prepared for future spells of hot weather.

The most important heat health tip is to drink plenty of liquids, Thompson said. "It's better if it's Gatorade or something like that," she said.

Sports drinks help replace electrolytes the body looses

through perspiration, Thompson said. She recommends Gatorade because it contains less sugar than many other brands.

Cool water is good, both to drink and to use as a means of cooling the body, she said.

For those who have fainted due to heat, Thompson suggested removing all clothing and applying cool compresses to the underarm and groin areas.

People outside should be moved to a shady area or an air conditioned room.

During extreme heat, Thompson said people should limit the amount of clothing they wear, dressing lightly and in light colors.

He and his family have moved to Hoopeston. The family includes his wife, Baftige, and children Tim, 17; Val, 16, Beana, 12 and Buddy, 10.


