Hoopeston chief, police plan to gang up on gang activity

Gang signs - in the form of graffiti in Hoopeston - are not necessarily signs of gang activity, but will be closely monitored by local police.

Gangs - their signs, symbols, colors and activities, was the topic of Monday's Hoopeston Neighborhood Watch meeting.

Approximately 45 people attended the meeting, which included two videos on gangs, as well as questions and answers with police Chief Carl Valentine.

"We have some copycat gangs," Valentine said. "We really don't, per se, have a really bad gang problem here in Hoopeston."

Valentine said he and members of his department plan to keep Hoopeston gang-free. "My main objective is to try to keep gangs out of Hoopeston," he said.

Education is the key to reaching that goal, he said. That includes educating officers, as well as citizens and young people.

ple," he said. "We've got to get to these young people (about the hazards of gangs.)"

Valentine stressed that just because a young person wears clothing associated with gang membership does not mean the youth is a gang member.

For example, gang members wear ball caps backwards or with the bill tipped to side. However, Valentine said, other youngsters wear their hats that was without a gang affiliation. "They don't know what it means," he said. "They just do it."

Also, clothing manufacturers have copied the dress worn by gang members, such as baggy pants and shirts.


