## Consultant affirms industrial corporation's marketing efforts

Efforts to market the Hoopeston Industrial Corporation's site are heading in the right direction, according to a Fort Wayne, Ind. planning and development consultant.

Consultant Mark Royse met with corporation directors and board members on July 24, touring the corporation's 51-acre site on Route 9 and community.

Royse's recommendations include more of what the corporation is already doing, said corporation treasurer Don Sherrill.

According to a press release issued by the corporation, Royse said the site is the only fully-developed industrial area in Vermilion County outside Danville. Soil borings and having necessary infrastructure elements in place should make the site very attractive, while adjacent railroad tracks and power sub-station are plusses.

Royse's recommendations include more aggressive marketing through improved communication with local, county and state agencies, using the Internet as a marketing tool and establishing relationships with community officials and leaders of existing industries to retain and assist them in expansion.

Royse was called in because directors wanted to "ask someone to look at what's here and how marketable it is," Sherrill said.

While Royse's suggestions provided no new insight, they "reinforced our feelings on the site that we have," Sherrill added. "We just wanted to find out if there were some things we ought to be doing that we weren't."

Sherrill said Royse's findings mean the board is heading in the right direction. "We just need to pursue it more, cultivate it more," he said.

The industrial corporation was formed in the 1950s as a means of attracting industry to Hoopeston.

The site, originally 65 acres, was made smaller when Casey's General Store bought approximately one acre for its store. Another parcel was sold to Grant Township as a storage area for road equipment and supplies.

In the press release, corporation president Harold Cox compared the group to "a young lady who has her wedding gown purchased, arrangements made for the church and reception hall, but no bride groom.

"We will seek that groom by enhancing our communications with Danville Area Economic Development Corporation and others," he said. "While Danville has been very successful, we need to position ourselves to attract additional suppliers and industries to complement Danville's progress."




