Trustee claims intimidation used in village disagreement

ROSSVILLE—A village trustee claims other officials are using intimidation tactics in a dispute concerning village policies.

Trustee William Galloway said a ticket he received for parking his truck across a sidewalk at his home is in retaliation against him questioning village bookkeeping and other practices.

The ticket, dated Aug. 1, was received after a special board meeting Aug. 5, Galloway said.

After receiving the ticket, Galloway and other members of RORR - Residents Organized to Reform Rossville - photographed other vehicles parked

across sidewalks in the village, including some vehicles allegedly owned by other officials.

Both police chief Paul Dewitt and Mayor Merv Smith deny the ticket is in retaliation.

Dewitt said the ticket resulted from a complaint from resident Robert Danner.

Smith said for such violations, citations are issued only when residents complain. "I've said before, if you enforce every ordinance on the books, you might as well not get out of bed," Smith said. "This came from a complaint."

Galloway said he intends to fight the ticket.


