3-day enrollment shows drop at Hoopeston Area schools

Declining enrollment and decreased state aid will affect the Hoopeston Area school district this year.

At Thursday's district school board meeting, Superintendent Don Dean presented three-day enrollment figures indicating the number of students dropped by 30 from last year.

"From where I sit, when you see 30 kids, that's \$75,000 floating away in state aid," he said.

The district has 1,604 students this year, down from last year and a decrease of nearly 300 students in the last six years, Dean said.

Also affecting the district's finances is roughly a \$100,000 net decrease in state aid, Dean said. "This is probably the first time in who knows when that it's gone down."

Although the state has a "hold harmless" policy to make up the difference lost in state aid, that money will be prorated at approximately 90 percent, Dean said. Prorating will result in a net loss of \$8,000 to \$9,000, he said.
