## Hoopeston hospital offers program to fight scary disease

If it's late October, it must be time for scary things. And time for Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital's program to help fight a truly scary thing - breast cancer.

The hospital is offering reduced prices on mammograms for local women, said mammogram technician Deb Rayls.

Each October, as part of Breast Cancer Awareness Month, the hospital offers a mammography special. This year's special runs from Oct. 26-30 and will allow area women to receive a mammogram for \$89. The cost, which includes the radiology fee, is 30 percent less than the regular cost.

The procedure takes only about 10 minutes, although 30 minutes are allowed for each appointment, Rayls said. In that time, two views of each breast will be taken. The views can be compared with earlier mammograms, or used as a baseline for women receiving their first procedure.

A baseline mammogram is recommended for women between 35 and 40. Women ages 40-50 should have the test every one or two years, while women over 40 should have an annual exam.

The most common fear of women who have not had a mammogram is the fear that it will hurt. But the fear is greatly exaggerated, Rayls said. "There's a difference between pain and being tight only for a few seconds," she said. "I've had maybe a couple over the last seven years that said it actually hurt. with the test's capacity to save a life. "We've picked up, on average, five to seven breast cancers locally, in the little community we have," Rayls said.

A mammogram is not foolproof. There are "a couple cancers that don't show up on mammograms, no matter how big," Rayls said. But the test, along with doctor's examinations and monthly self-exams, will help in early detection of most lumps, whether cancerous or benign.

Women 35 or older may call the hospital, (217) 283-5531, ext. 252, to schedule an appointment. Women under 35 will need a doctor's order before scheduling an appointment. Ravls said.
