Computer change may test hospital patients' patience

Officials at Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital and Nursing Home hope their patients will have patience.

A change in computer systems means patients will experience delays in registration, said Frank Caruso, the facility's chief operating and financial officer.

The system will go on-line Feb. 2. "The most frustrating part for the community - and the staff - will be February and March," Caruso said. "If you haven't been a patient at the hospital in a while, our staff is going to have to ask a lot of questions."

information, which officials will use to make decisions about the facility's future, Caruso said.

Answering questions during the registration process is expected to take 15 to 30 minutes.

New computers and software were purchased from CPSI, a company focusing on small and medium-sized health care facilities, Caruso said.

The new system, which will be implemented throughout the hospital, cost nearly \$500,000, including staff time, he said.

Employees, guided by CPSI representatives, will focus on registration in early February, followed by billing in late February and early March. Procedures for the nurs-


