Industrial corporation to explore ways of attracting industry

The Hoopeston Industrial Corporation must renew its efforts to bring industry to Hoopeston, said the group president.

"We've got to keep pushing, keep harassing them, whatever you call it, and just keep going," said chairman Harold Cox.

Cox spoke at the group's annual meeting Wednesday night.

Cox reported that state Rep. Bill Black (R-Danville) said industries continue to look places to build or expand. "We need to get with him," Cox said, adding the corporation will also work with state officials, as well as the Danville Area Economic Development Corporation, to bring industry to Hoopeston.

In other business Wednesday, the corporation approved lowering the number of directors from nine to seven. The group's by-laws call for a seven-member board, said secretary Jean Minick.

Former directors Eddie Edwards and Jim Hardy chose not to seek re-election.


