### Local chief, officers cleared in audit of drug seizure funds

A state police audit has cleared the Hoopeston Police Department of any wrongdoing in handling a drug seizure account.

"They verbally told me I didn't have anything to worry about," said Chief Carl Valentine Tuesday, shortly after an exit interview with state police investigators. "All the money has been accounted for."

Valentine, and the department, came under scrutiny after the state police received calls regarding reports that Valentine had misspent drug seizure money.

Valentine has said he believes the reports came from officers disgruntled about changes made since he became chief, such as abolishing seniority-based scheduling.

"I guess you could say I was wrongly accused," he said.

The account contains money seized in drug-related arrests. Once money is taken, it must be turned over to the state which keeps 35 percent of it, returning the remaining 65 percent to the originating department.

Investigators stressed that the department must submit the money to the state, Valentine said. "They want to make sure the money's not spent until it gets back to us," he said.

Valentine said when he took over as chief last year, the account had approximately \$4,000. Since then, he has spent part of the money for new cages in squad cars, shoulder patches for officers and new fingerprinting equipment. Prior to Valentine coming, some funds were also used for a computer, he said.

Investigators will file a written report that will be sent to Valentine. The report will indicate ways the local department can "fine-tune the paperwork" involved for the account, Valentine said.

Investigators also examined procedures for tracking and disposing of evidence, Valentine said. Some evidence, such as old knives, will be disposed of. Guns and drugs must cannot be gotten
