Giant party planned for third annual cancer society relay

Some local people will be running for their lives - and for others, too - later this month.

Approximately 30 teams, including three with members from Hoopeston, will take part in the Relay for Life May 15 and 16.

The relay, sponsored by the Vermilion County chapter of the American Cancer Society, raises funds to fight cancer, said event chairman Bill Goodwine.

During the 24-hour relay, teams, comprised of six to 15 people, must have one member running or walking around a track at all times. Thirty teams are expected to participate in the relay, at Ellsworth Park in Danville. McFerren Park is the event's alternate site.

Unlike many other fundraisers, relay participants collect funds before the event, making the relay "a big party for a job well done, basically," Goodwine said.

Last year, \$29,000 was raised, \$2,300 of it from Goodwine's team made up mostly of local high school students. This year, the event goal is \$50,000 and Goodwine hopes his team, the Hopeless Hoboes from Hoopeston, will make a good showing.

Participants do more than log laps on the track, Goodwine said. An Olympic trophy is given to the team with the highest total scores from events including coed

volleyball and basketball, line dancing/macarena, karaoke, a Gong Show-like talent contest, ("for those who don't have any talent," Goodwine said) best dinner cooked on-site, euchre, Trivial Pursuit, best breakfast, home run derby and pajama and sunbonnet contests.

Goodwine's team last year, Cornjerkers Camping to Conquer Cancer, ("We have a thing for alliteration," he said) won the dinner portion, wearing chef hats while ladling up their jambalaya.

A luminary ceremony is scheduled for 9 p.m. Last year 1,500 candles lit the park, in memory of those who have died from cancer or honoring survivors.

Other entertainment is scheduled, including vocal performances by Kena Clark and Joanie Cundiff and a magic show by Michael Clary.

Last year, about 350 people attended the event. Goodwine expects the number to increase to 500 in this, the relay's third year.

With so many activities, few of the participants sleep during the relay, which begins and ends at noon. "We label it as Vermilion County's biggest slumber party," Goodwine said.
