Famous lizard to stomp into Lorraine Theatre Tuesday

Leapin' lizards!

Stomping lizards will be more like it when "Godzilla" comes to the Lorraine Theatre this week.

The film being billed as the biggest movie of the summer will have a sneak preview at 8 p.m. Tuesday, one day before the film opens nationwide, said Lorraine owner Greg Boardman.

The billing may be well-deserved, said Boardman, who previewed the film last week at a special preview for exhibitors. The movie's computer effects are "really, really well done," he said. "It's going to be a hell of a

ride."

With a May 20 opening date, many theaters are showing sneak previews Tuesday, Boardman said. Sony Pictures "knew that there'd be a lot of interest," Boardman said. "It's basically for bragging rights."

"Godzilla" will open on 7,363 screens in 3,310 theaters, breaking the previous record of 6,190 screens when "The Lost World: Jurassic Park" opened on Memorial Day last year.

While many theaters are showing the film, Boardman said local movie-goers will get the fullest sound right here at the Lorraine.

The audio portion, in eight-channel Sony Dynamic Digital Sound, will be very realistic. "I just can't imagine how it's going to sound at the Lorraine. You're going to feel your chest shake."

The theater sound system was revamped recently to include the eight-channel system used in "Godzilla", Boardman said. "When "Godzilla" roars and stomps, you won't just hear it, you're going to feel it," he said. "The sound is truly unbelievable."

The Lorraine is the only theater outside the Chicago area equipped to play all eight channels, he added. Sound is divided into five channels behind the screen, up from three, two discrete channels of surround sound and one channel of sound dedicated for the subwoofer channel.

The improved system will make each movie-goer "feel like a participant in the action," Boardman said. "I want you to feel like you're in the middle of whatever's going on in the movie."

Just as movie theaters across the country are going allout for "Godzilla", so, too, are local merchants. Coinciding with the film's opening, many Hoopeston businesses will be offering special savings during a Monster Sale this week.

Storefronts throughout Hoopeston have been painted with "Godzilla" footprints and demolished cars will appear later this week to show "Godzilla"'s destruction. One located in front of the theater, will smoke from its recent demolition at the feet of the monster.

As an added attraction, those who attend the sneak preview performance will receive a free commemorative "Godzilla" ticket provided by Sony Pictures. Tickets will be distributed on a first come, first served basis, Boardman said.
