tient payments so that hospitals can give more care in the cost-effective outpatient setting.

The budget increase addressed a very real problem. Medicaid currently pays hospitals only about 40 percent of what it costs them to provide outpatient care. It is simply not possible to provide good, efficient care at those rates.

Restructuring outpatient rates sends the right message: Illinois wants its Medicaid patients to be treated in the most cost-effective setting, just as com-

when the Hoopeston Fire Department was called during stormy conditions.

Reducing the times the siren is sounded will also save wear and tear on the system. "The siren's getting to the place where it should be replaced but there's no money," said Drollinger, who was instrumental in getting the existing siren.

The estimated cost for a new siren is \$22,000 to \$23,000. A new siren would have several different tones, a public address system, battery back-up and would be heard throughout a larger part of the city. Grants are available but only for municipalities which have been damaged by a tornado. "I don't want that to happen," Drollinger said. "With my luck, it would hit my house."
