Funny money not so funny to law enforcement officials

Law enforcement officials are warning residents and business owners that counterfeit money is circulating in Hoopeston.

Fake bills are part of an investigation that "encompasses the Hoopeston and Danville area," said Jack Fox, Secret Service resident agent in charge, Springfield.

An on-going investigation is focusing on phony \$20, \$50 and \$100 bills. Fox said.

Locally, the most common counterfeit bill is the \$20, said Investigator Chuck Moyer of the Hoopeston Police Department. Some fake \$50 bills have also been found, he said.

The color of the phony money is dingier than real bills, Moyer said. Residents and business owners should also look for smudges and incomplete printing on the bills, Moyer said. The texture of the paper is also different from the real thing. "If you handle enough money, you should know what it feels like," Moyer said.

Additionally, both the \$20 and \$50 bills do not have security strips and the fake \$50s, copies of the newer ones, do not have a watermark, he said.

Although officials have not released a dollar amount of counterfeit money being passed, "a substantial amount is still out," Moyer said.

Counterfeit bills began showing up locally about one month ago, Moyer said. Several businesses, including banks and grocery stores, have been victims of the fake.

Two people, including a Hoopeston man, have been arrested on state charges for passing the bills, said Gary Miller, Vermilion County Sheriff's Department chief investigator.

Robert S. Akers, 20, of Hoopeston, and Michael L. Lammey, 20, of Danville, were arrested July 10, Miller

Further arrests may be pending "We feel that we've identified the source of the bills," Fox said. "We anticipate some federal indictments."

Those who suspect they may have received counterfeit money should do three things. First, Fox said, "don't get hung up on any particular denomination," he said, add-



ing counterfeits include everything from \$1 to \$100 bills.

Second, merchants should be aware of suspicious transactions, such as a customer paying for a candy bar with a \$20 when he has other money, or a customer who makes a purchase then immediately returns it.

Third, suspicious bills should be compared with bills believed to be legitimate, Fox said.

A fourth suggestion is to buy a special pen that differentiates between real and counterfeit bills. The pens, available for about \$5 at O'Herrons and Arnold's Office Supply in Danville, contain ink that changes color when marked on a counterfeit bill, Moyer said.

Businesses that receive counterfeit money should accept it and notify officials "We've had a lot of stores give it right back to them," Fox said. "That does us no

good at all."

Possessing counterfeit money does not mean a person will be arrested, Moyer said. Those possessing the funny money will be interviewed by police to determine where
