

Tougher standards, new laws to crack down on junk cars

Tougher wording and new ordinances will make it easier for city officials to crack down on junk vehicles in the city.

In a 6-2 vote July 21, the Hoopeston city council approved changes to existing ordinances covering junk vehicles, as well as the sale of tobacco or alcohol to minors.

The junk car ordinance covers abandoned, derelict and inoperable vehicles.

An abandoned vehicle is one that is in a state of disrepair rending the vehicle capable of being driven or one that has not been moved or used for seven

A derelict vehicle is one that is inoperable, unregistered or discarded while inoperable vehicles are those which, for at least seven days, have had the engine, wheels or other parts removed, altered or damaged so the vehicle cannot be driven under its own power. This does not include vehicles temporarily incapable of being driven in order to perform ordinary service or repair operation.

a tarp will not provide protection under the new ordinances, said city attorney Karen Wall. The changes include a section calling for derelict vehicles to be "under the cover of a building or structure."

Derelict vehicles which are identified as a "rodent or insect harborage" may be removed from property even if they are stored properly, she said.

The ordinances cut down on the amount of time an inoperable vehicle may be on property. Under old ordinances, vehicles often could be kept for six months.

Aldermen Dave Borders and Mark Drollinger voted against the changes. Borders cited the fact that owners sometimes do not move their vehicles for seven days, which does not make them abandoned.

Drollinger voted no partially because of changes made last year in the city's bad check ordinance, a change Drollinger wanted removed.

That change keeps the city from prosecuting bad

checks under a total of \$100. "We want to attract merchants but we're turning our backs on the merchants that are here," he said.

Drollinger also found no favor with the tobacco/ alcohol ordinance pertaining to minors saying those infractions are already covered by state law and could be prosecuted under those

The tobacco ordinance prohibits the sale, gift or delivery of tobacco to anyone under 18, except under the direct supervision of a parent or guardian in the parent or guardian's home.

Prohibited products include cigarettes, cigars, pipe tobacco, snuff, chewing tobacco and dipping tobacco.

The alcohol ordinance prohibits the sale, delivery or gift of alcohol to anyone under 21.
