#### Suggestion to change police hiring stalls on council floor

A move to give the Hoopeston city council more input in choosing police officers and chiefs was halted at Tuesday's meeting.

Alderman John Haughee, chairman of the city police committee, suggested a change in the ordinance, giving the committee authority to act with the police commission to make hiring decisions.

Currently, officers and chiefs are screened and interviewed by the Hoopeston Police Commission. Last year when former chief Carl Valentine was hired, interviews were opened to city council members.

Haughee said his suggestion stemmed from comments from another, unidentified alderman. After the meeting, Haughee said he will "chat with him and see where he's coming from."

Alderman Dave Borders agreed with Haughee. "I feel we should have a say in this," he said. "It's the biggest department we have here in the city. I feel we should have the final say."

However, no aldermen made a motion to change the existing ordinance.

Haughee complained that the council has yet to meet the department's newest officer, Billy Pryor, and that Valentine's resignation earlier this month "caught us off-guard."

While some officials favor council input into the selection process, interim Chief Joe Gaffney said a change might deter candidates from applying for the chief's position. "If you get good candidates and they feel politics is involved, you're going to lose good candidate because they don't want to work under politics," he said. "That's my feeling."

In unrelated action, the council:

#### Rossville-Alvin school budget shows \$99,000 shortfall

ROSSVILLE—School officials will have to dip into savings to meet this year's \$3.1 million budget.

The budget, placed on public display, was discussed at Monday's Rossville-Alvin school board meeting. The 1998-99 budget includes a \$99,000 shortfall, said Superintendent Phil Smith. "We're going to have to take some from our reserves," he said. Salaries and computer costs are the largest components of the financial picture, he

In other business, the board learned Smith, along with superintendents from the Armstrong, Potomac and Bismark-Henning districts will meet to "run some numbers on what it would be to run two districts," Smith said.

The districts, looking at consolidating, are currently considering separate grade and high school districts to eliminate a problem with Armstrong district land located in Champaign County, Smith said.

The superintendents are expected to set an early September meeting date.

In other action, the board:

accepted the resignation of athletic director Jeff Maupin. Maupin, who will teach in Danville, will remain football coach.

hired Dawn Sangkawatana, C.A.R.E. teacher; Marcia Olsen, junior/senior high art; and Tina Samet, district cook.




