Landfill owners begin clean-up, meeting agreement requirements

Clean-up of an old landfill is underway.

Trash in the former Tweedy Landfill, located on property now owned by Illinois Landfills, Inc., will be exhumed and reburied, said Jim VanWeelden, Director of Compliance and Landfill Development for Illinois Landfills, Inc., a subsidiary of Allied Waste Industries.

Some refuse from the Tweedy site has been relocated to provide the coverage of a composite liner, VanWeelden said. The remaining trash will be exhumed in 1999 and 2000, he said.

Cleaning the Tweedy site was part of an agreement between Illinois Landfills and the city.

Other conditions include construction of an access road to the landfill. Excavation on the road began last week.

Also, trash pick-up rates in the city have been frozen at current rates for 10 years.

Illinois Landfills must also provide a recycling program in the community. While a curbside pickup program was discussed earlier, VanWeelden said company and city officials are meeting to determine the type of recycling program will best benefit Hoopeston.

Illinois Landfills received permission to expand their current 35-acre site to 120.5 acres in February.

Road may honor Cornjerkers

A new road in Hoopeston may pay tribute to local sports teams.

Excavation has begun on an access road to Hoopeston's landfill. The road will be located south off Route 9 through Hoopeston Industrial Corporation property.

Mayor Bob Ault said he plans to ask the Hoopeston city council to name the road after the Hoopeston Cornjerkers. His request is expected to come at the Sept. 1 council meeting.

The request should not come as a surprise to the council. Earlier this year, Ault requested Orange St. be changed to Cornjerker Drive, but public criticism nixed the change. It was then that the suggestion arose to name the new road after the school mascot. "We more or less left it that way when we ran into all those obstacles," Ault said.

Excavation began last week, said Jim VanWeelden, Director of Compliance and Landfill Development for Illinois Landfills, Inc., a subsidiary of Allied Waste Industries.

Zenerre Excavating is doing the initial work, while Iroquois Paving will do the actual construction. The road is expected to be completed in four to six weeks, VanWeelden said.

Although Sunday alcohol sales are banned by ordinance, some people, including Alderman Mark Drollinger, who voted against the veto, said the action will hurt benefits and other activities sometimes scheduled on Sundays.
