Florida woman takes home Sweetheart title on birthday

It's not every day that a woman turns 23 and wins the title of a pageant noted for showcasing future Miss America winners.

But that is what happened Sunday. Keri Lynn Schrader turned 23 and took home the title following the Miss National Sweetheart Pageant.

The pageant is part of the National Sweetcorn Festival which ended yesterday.

Hoopeston man makes history in 20th annual 5K race

A Hoopeston man ran into the record books Saturday as the first local man to win the annual Sweetcorn 5K race.

John Shaffer beat a field of 187 to be the overall winner with a time of 15:48, the first time since the race began in 1978 that a Hoopeston runner has led the field.

"(Shaffer) pretty much took command," said organizer Bill Orr. "He took the lead and kept it."

This was Shaffer's third effort, Orr said. The young man finished 10th his first try and was fifth last year, he said.

The race was a family affair for Shaffer. His sister, Kristi, placed 34th overall and first in the female 19-24 category with a time of 20:01. His mother, Betty, placed 128th overall and second in the female 45-49 group at 25:34.

The race was a family affair for a Rantoul couple, as well.

Mary Toohill was the top woman runner, setting a women's record with 17:41, breaking the existing 17:50 time. Toohill finished 13th overall.

Her husband, Michael Mallon was second overall winner in the men's competition, finishing at 13:56 behind Shaffer.

This was Toohill's first time at the local race. The runner usually attends a larger competition in Park Forest, Orr said.

While Shaffer made history, other local runners finished with respectable times. "There was quite a good showing among Hoopeston runners," Orr said. Other local runners of note included:




