Childhood dream become reality for police officer trainee

A Chrisman man's childhood dream has become a reality.

Darin Tate, 25, of Chrisman, joined the Hoopeston Police Department on Sept. 14.

Tate will work with officers this week, then will attend the University of Illinois Police Training Institute for 12 weeks before returning to the department full time.

The job is a dream come true for Tate. "I've wanted to be a police officer since I was a little kid," he said. "I really don't know exactly why."

Tate, who will move to Hoopeston once his training is completed, was graduated from Chrisman High School. He then attended Indiana State University in Terre Haute, receiving a BS in criminology in 1996.

After graduation, he worked for his parents, Don and Karen Tate, at Karen's Kottage in Danville be-

fore become loss prevention supervisor at Elder Beerman at the Village Mall in Danville.

He got his first law enforcement experience while attending college, when he interned with the Edgar County Sheriff's Department.

His favorite part of that training was finding people who were wanted on warrants. "I liked hunting them and finding out where they live," he said.

That talent for finding people may lead to career advancement. Tate hopes to perhaps become an investigator, but his goal is to work for the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Reaching that goal will take more schooling and a three-year stint with one employer, he said.

Tate learned of the Hoopeston opening, applied, and is glad he got the job. "It's so hard to get in a lot of places," he said.

Voter registration aids available for disabled residents

Vermilion County residents who, due to a disability, are unable to register to vote in person may contact the county clerk's Voter Registration Department for assistance.

The department's phone number is (217) 283-6688. Residents who call may arrange for a bipartisan team

of deputy registrars to provide in-home registration, said County Clerk Lynn Foster.

Oct. 6 is the last day for county residents outside Danville to register for the Nov. 3 primary election.

Foster also reminded residents that those who are disabled or incapacitated may vote by absentee ballot. Those wishing to vote absentee by mail should request an application from the county clerk's office as soon as possible after Sept. 24. The last day absentee ballots may be mailed to a voter is Oct. 29.

Voters who are permanently disabled may request an application for a special identification card with will allow them to automatically receive absentee ballot applications for every election for five years. The care is renewable. "This card is very convenient for our permanently disabled voters," Foster said. "We have had great success with this program."


