New Ward 1 alderman gets Hoopeston council approval

Ward I residents have a new face representing them. Rodney Kaag was approved Tuesday by the Hoopes-

ton city council to replace Mark Drollinger. Drollinger resigned his seat Dec. 31 to become the city's police

Kaag, 36, comes to the council without preconceived ideas of what he will accomplish. "I have no plans other than to do my best for my constituents and the people of Hoopeston," he said. He is pleased to be a part of something that will "hopefully make by children as proud to call Hoopeston home as I have been."

The newest alderman is a lifelong Hoopeston resident and 1980 graduate of Hoopeston-East Lynn High School and attended Danville Area Community College.

For the past 14 years, he has been employed by the

Vermilion County Sheriff's Department. He spent nine years on patrol, more than three years in drug investigations and is currently assigned to criminal investigations.

He is a Grant II Republican precinct committeman and has been involved with several electoral campaigns, including those for state Sen. Judy Myers, former sheriff Gene Hughes and recorder Nancy Kelly.

Kaag is a member of the East Lynn United Methodist Church and the Sons of the American Legion, Hoopeston. He and his wife, Misti, have four daughters, Katie, 15; Courtney, 14; Kali, 11; and Keri, 6.

"I look forward to the opportunity to serve the people of Hoopeston," Kaag said. "I hope I can do as good a job as my predecessor."

Kaag plans to run for the seat in the April election.

Mayor says trustees will work with special prosecutor

ROSSVILLE—Trustees here will work with a special prosecutor investigating allegations of wrongdoing by the village board.

The issue was discussed at Monday's Rossville village board meeting, said Mayor Merv Smith.

Former Vermilion County state's attorney Mike Clary last year requested a special prosecutor to look into allegations made by a citizens' group and trustee Bill Gallo-

Papers filed by Clary on July 21, 1998, state that allegations stem from 1993 to 1998 and include failure to follow bidding procedures required by state law, conflicts of interest with board members voting on matters, irregularities in setting natural gas rates, use of motor fuel tax money for improvements on private property and intentional misrepresentation of the village's finances in official reports.

Clary's motion said that some village residents with information on the allegations were unwilling to speak with his office or investigators affiliated with the office and that, to avoid the appearance of impropriety, a special prosecutor should be appointed.

Smith said the prosecutor, from Springfield, has not yet been at the village office. "We will cooperate fully with the special prosecutor and his assistants whenever they arrive," Smith said.

In other business, trustees approved crediting residents who have let their water run to avoid freezing pipes and water meters. Details of the credit will be worked out by the water/sewer committee, Smith said.

In unrelated action, trustees:

□approved spending no more than \$7,000 to purchase a rebuilt engine for a village tractor.


