Rotarian heads to warmer climate, cultural exchange

While the rest of us are getting through the remainder of winter, Ed Layden Jr. will spend a month where it's warm.

The trip is not a typical vacation, however. Layden will lead a five-member team to the Philippines on a Rotary Group Study Exchange (GSE) trip.

The team leaves Saturday and will spend approximately one month learning about Philippine culture and its economy.

The group will be headquartered in Cebu, the second largest city, with a population of about 1.5 million people, but will visit other towns on some of the more than 7,000 islands that comprise the Philippines. In all, the team will see 10 cities with stays of two to 10 days in each, Layden said.

Participating in a GSE trip is something Layden has wanted to do for a while, but this is the first time the timing has worked out. "It's usually later in the year, so I couldn't go because of farming," he said, adding even this time of year will prove difficult. "When I come back in the middle of March, it's going to be tight."

"Who gets what" is the subject of a free program Thursday at Country Terrace Apartments, 705 E. Orange, Hoopeston. While in the Philippines, team members will spend time with counterparts in their fields of interest. Layden and another member will pursue agricultural knowledge, while other team members will focus on education, elder care and care of the disabled.

"I hope I learn something," Layden said. "Farmers, we all do something a little bit different, even though, basically, we do the same thing."

The group will stay with Philippine host families to better observe the culture but Layden expects few language barriers. "They speak Filipino but are taught English in school," he said.

Living conditions may be a bigger challenge for the group. "It's going to be a little harsher than (areas) some GSEs go to," Layden said. For example, he expects few hot showers to be available during the trip.

Where GSE teams go is decided almost two years before anyone actually boards a plane. Sites are chosen by the incoming district governor. Hoopeston Rotarian See ROTARIAN on other side

Gary Shore will be next year's district governor and hopes to field two GSE trips, one to Kobe, Japan and a second, strictly for educators, to Singapore/Malaysia.

The average GSE trip puts team members as guests in six to eight homes, Shore said. The trip is funded by Rotary, except for gifts team members take to their host families or bring back for friends and family here.

To become a team member, individuals must apply to their local Rotary club. Names are then submitted to a GSE committee, which selects one Rotarian and four non-members for each team.

Layden is not the first Hoopeston resident to participate in a GSE trip. John White was among the first to go, with a trip to Norway, Shore said. Other participants have included Steve Unger, Mark Conolly, Peter Krimbel and Shore.

While providing an exchange of information between countries, the program also provides once-in-a-lifetime opportunities for participants.

For example, on Shore's GSE to Japan in 1992, the team stayed with a member of the Mazda car manufacturing family. "Those types of things just aren't (normally) open to you even if you have all the money in the world," he said.
