Final four list thoughts on Hoopeston Area school issues

Editor's Note: This is the final part of a series of articles outlining candidates for office in Hoopeston and Rossville.



Enrollment and finances are issues for two of four candidates for Hoopeston Area school board, while maintaining existing positives is a concern of two others.

Dana Haley, 45, said keeping the enrollment up is a top priority, as is maintaining the district's strengths while improving weak areas.

Such improvements, he said, will make the district

more attractive to newcomers or in future consolidation discussions.

Haley said he will bring his experience as a parent of children in the district to the board, as well as his experience working with children

and organizations.

Haley has an associate's degree from Parkland College, attended the University of Illinois and is owner of Haley's Electric Inc.

Bruce Lockhart, 40, also sees finances and declining
