Program shows how prom activities can be 'wrecked'

ROSSVILLE-Jamie Burk, a Rossville-Alvin High School, must have looked stunning Monday in a silver prom dress.

It was hard to tell, however, because Burk's upper body was extended through the windshield of a Dodge Sable, covered with the coat of a Rossville fireman.

Burk and fellow students Adam Fritz, Felicia Mahorney and Mike Bray were part of a demonstration on the possible consequences of drinking and driving.

The demonstration was conducted by the village's fire, ambulance, rescue squad and police departments, as well as the Vermilion County Sheriff's Department and coroner's office.

According to the scenario, Fritz, who had too much to drink at prom, decided to take a few laps around the track in his car. After driving at an excessive speed, Fritz rolled the car, and his date, Burk, went through the windshield.

Fake blood covered the scene as members of the Rossville Rescue Squad cut the car apart to extricate the stu-

Using the story outline, emergency medical technicians discovered both girls had "died." After they were taken from the wreckage, they were taken from the scene in a Wolfe Funeral Home hearse.

Bray, severely "injured," was taken by ambulance and was expected to be transferred.

Fritz, the driver, flunked a field sobriety test. He was "charged" with driving under the influence of alcohol and faced the prospect of vehicular manslaughter charges, as well.

Playing a drunk driver was "not too fun," said Fritz after the drama finished. "I was wonderin" what it would be like if it really happened. It's scary. Being in a fake setting is scary."

Fritz, who plans to attend the prom this weekend, said Monday's dramatization will be on his mind while he parties. "I'll be thinking about it a lot," he said.

Rossville seeks residents' help to receive state grants

ROSSVILLE—Village officials are requesting assistance from residents receiving state grants.
