Fire heavily damages local eatery during lunch hour

The Hoopeston Fire Department and Illinois State Fire Marshall's Office is investigating a fire Friday at the Hoopeston Garden Family Restaurant.

The fire, which broke out at lunch time, damaged the kitchen of the restaurant, at 728 W. Penn. Further damage was caused by heat, smoke and water.

Firemen were called to the scene at 12:13 p.m. after a broiler reportedly caught fire. Customers and employees were evacuated and no injuries were reported.

Firemen remained on the scene for approximately 90 minutes, and the Rossville Fire Department was called for mutual aid.

The restaurant is managed by Alit Musaj and Dave LaBounty. The men reportedly plan to reopen the eatery.

This is the second family-style restaurant to be destroyed by fire in Hoopeston. The first, Hoopeston Family Restaurant, at 224 E. Penn, burned in 1995.

The burned building sat vacant until last month when it was torn down.

Hoopeston Industrial Corp. to keep land for industrial use

The Hoopeston Industrial Corporation has shot down a suggestion that a proposed sports complex be located on corporation land.

At a meeting April 27, the HIC board voted to keep its property intact. "The property is not for sale for non-industrial purposes because we don't have another suitable industrial site available," said HIC board president Harold Cox.

A steering committee considering a sports complex

suggested HIC land as a suitable site for the complex. A second suggestion – land behind Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital and Nursing Home, has drawn fire from hospital employees and residents of Country Terrace, an independent living complex.

Mayor Bob Ault has previously said he is considering another site not suggested by the committee. Ault is expected to approach the Hoopeston city council about that location.


