Fortune 500 company to purchase 147 Pamida stores

The Hoopeston Pamida, along with 146 other Pamida stores, is expected to have a new owner in July.

ShopKo Stores, Inc., a Fortune 500 company, and Pamida Holdings Corporation have signed a definitive agreement for ShopKo to acquire Pamida. Under the agreement, ShopKo will assume Pamida's \$265 million in debt and capitalized lease obligations.

The agreement will mean few changes for the Hoopeston Pamida store, said manager Tim George. The store's name will remain the same and the same people will work there, he said.

Employees were told of the planned acquisition Tuesday morning. "They seem to be fairly positive," George said. "They think it's good."

Stores that Pamida had previously decided to close

will be probably be closed under the new deal, but that will not affect the local store. "They had no plans to close this store because it's profitable," George said.

The combination of the two companies will be "a good fit for each other," George said. Pamida operates in smaller markets, with 92 percent of stores in areas with trade populations of less than 20,000. ShopKo has 158 stores in areas of 20,000 to more than 300,000.

"We have identified more than 500 small rural markets that could support a Pamida retail store, said William J. Podany, ShopKo president and chief executive officer. "The Pamida retail strategy of convenience is a natural fit for these rural markets.

Pamida will continue to be headquartered in Omaha, Neb. ShopKo's headquarters are in Green Bay, Wis.

Dignitaries gather for medical center groundbreaking

Local dignitaries gathered Tuesday afternoon for the ceremonial groundbreaking for Hoopeston's new medical center.

Members of the Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital and Nursing Home board of directors, city officials and members of the Hoopeston Health Care Foundation executive committee wielded shovels at the ceremony.

"This is a new journey for the hospital and the community of Hoopeston," said Frank Caruso, hospital chief executive officer.

"This is a very proud day for the hospital," said hospital board president Russ Leigh.

The hospital plans to build a \$1.5 million medical center east of the hospital and a \$2 million renovation of the hospital.

Most funds will be received from a \$9 million bond

issue, but \$1 million will come from foundation fundraising over the next three years. To date, \$175,000 has been raised, said foundation chairman Steve Margevich.

Construction on the medical center is expected to begin this summer.
