Obviously no one has told Mother Nature the start of summer is still almost two weeks away.

A combination of temperatures in the 90s and high humidity will cause discomfort for many residents.

To help ease the heat for elderly residents, the Hoopeston Multi Agency has started a fan loaning program.

Fifteen fans were donated to the agency, said assistant director Susan Redden. Fans were donated by Olympic Hardware, Pamida and Lowe's of Danville.

Fans will be given to low-income senior citizens on a first come, first served basis. Fans should be reserved by calling the Multi Agency at 283-5544. Seniors may then pick up the fans or they may be delivered by Multi Agency employees.

If more fans are donated or if fewer than 15 senior citizens request them, fans will then be made available to disabled residents, Redden said.

Health care professionals encourage all people to take precautions during hot weather, including:

□remaining indoors, with a fan or air conditioner. □shopping. While many homes may not be airconditioned, stores usually are. Stay cool and take advantage of summer sales.

wearing loose-fitting, light-colored clothing.

drinking plenty of fluids, particularly water. Alcoholic beverages and drinks containing caffeine may cause dehydration.

The making sure children are not left unattended in parked cars, especially with the windows closed.

Those who have been exposed to too much heat may suffer from heat exhaustion or heat stroke, and may perspire profusely or become cold. Dizziness is another symptom.

Assistance for people suffering from either condition include loosening clothing and placing cool towels on the face and neck. Victims who do not respond should get immediate medical attention.

Residents are reminded that pets are also affected by hot weather. Pets should be kept indoors or have plenty of shade. Owners are urged to keep a fresh supply of cool water available at all times.

Finally, pets should not be left in unattended vehicles, especially ones with closed windows.
