Sidewalk repairs less taxing second time around: owner

Robin Lawson knows a thing or two about sidewalk repairs.

She doesn't actually know how to do them. She's just familiar with the effects.

Lawson, of Global Fashions, is the only Hoopeston businesswoman to be affected twice by downtown sidewalk repairs.

Two years ago, when repairs were made on the 200 block of East Main. Lawson dealt with the effects of having the street and sidewalk in front of her store torn up. After moving to 305 E. Main last year, Lawson is being reminded of the headaches all over again.

Lawson will attest to the fact that having the entrance to one's store demolished is not good for business. During the summer, Lawson usually puts some merchandise on the sidewalk as part of an ongoing sidewalk sale. That is not happening right now, which is affecting sales. Sales were also affected when the 200 block was repaired. "I'm still trying to get caught up from the last time," she said.

However, crews seem to be making the trying time less trying. Workers placed gravel from the street to Global's front door to make walking easier for customers. "They seem to generally care," Lawson said.

Also, repairs seem to be going faster this time. "I do think this time they're moving more quickly," she said.

During repairs, customers are using the back doors of many businesses, including Global Fashions. That is something that did not happen the last time. "We've got a good entrance in the back," she said, "and I think people are used to (going in the back door at L&M, so maybe that's helping me."

Lawson's attitude has also changed somewhat since the first time. "There's nothing I can do about it," she said. "I tell myself it's going to be really nice when it gets done."

Global Fashions customers will reap the rewards of the repairs. Lawson plans to host a customer appreciation celebration when repairs are finished. The event is tentative scheduled for July 15-16.

The Vermilion County Health Department is reminding parents to make sure their children meet state requirements for hepatitis B immunizations.

Illinois school code requires all students entering fifth,

sixth or seventh grades to have the hepatitis B series. All children two years or older who are entering a childcare facility or pre-kindergarten program must also be immunized. It takes at leas four months to complete the series of shots.

Parents should contact their child's health care provider as soon as possible. Immunizations are also available from the Vermilion County Health Department for \$6 each. For more information, call (217) 283-2662.
