The generosity of area residents will mean the proposed veterans memorial will be dedicated on time. Last weekend's street corner drive by the American Legion, V.F.W. and Amvets to fund the memorial raised \$4,488. said Robert Inman, one of the people behind the drive. The money raised will help organizers meet the deadline set for dedicating the monument, Veteran's Day, Nov. 11.

"We're going to make November," Inman said. "About all we have to do now is go to work."

The planned design of the Grant Township Veter-Silver Brothers is expected ans Memorial, which will be erected in McFerren their country. "We're going to to pour concrete for the foun-

dation next week at McFerren Park. Inman said that work has been paid for, as has half of the \$12,000 needed to purchase six black polished stones on which names of Grant Township veterans will be placed.

The grouping will include two stones each sized 4'x6', $4'x5'_{2}$ and 4'x5'. Both sides of each stone will be polished to allow names to be added, if needed.

Organizers are purchasing the stones from Hoopeston Monument. Owners Dave and Penny Gaddis will donate time and materials to put each veteran's name on the monument, Inman said.

The group plans to place three flagpoles, costing \$1,500 each, at the front of the monument, Inman said.

The entire monument will be lighted. That lighting will be provided by Star Lodge \$709, which volunteered

to install lighting and pay for electricity. "We've had that since about Day 1," Inman said, adding there was a time when organizers thought the project would never get to the stage where it had to be lighted.

"When the thing first started, there wasn't any interest," he said. "but about four or five months ago, it really kicked in and it's been going crazy."

Sure now that enough money will be raised to pay for the memorial, organizers are collecting names of township residents who have served

pen," Inman said. "I'm sure the closer it gets, the more people will jump in and work on the names."

This is not the first time a memorial has been suggested for Hoopeston. In fact, Inman said, the idea has come up two or three times, but lack of interest and funds cancelled the plans.

All that is different this time. "It's going to happen – we know that now," he said.
