Water report has acceptable levels in Hoopeston, Rossville

Drinking water in Hoopeston and Rossville was below accepted levels of contaminants in 1998.

Details of contaminants and levels, part of the 1998 water quality data report mandated by the Environmental Protection Agency, has been sent to all Rossville water customers and will be sent to Hoopeston customers within a week, said water superintendent Steve Baker.

Baker oversees water quality in both Hoopeston and Rossville.

The reports, which must be mailed to customers annually, show both water systems tested below maximum levels for arsenic, barium, copper and fluoride. In state-regulated tests, both were below maximums for manganese and sodium. Rossville, however, was above the maximum level of iron.

According to Hoopeston's report, arsenic levels measured 5 parts per billion, well below the maximum contaminant level of 50. Barium levels were 0.063 parts per million, with an acceptable maximum level of 2 ppm.

Copper tested at 0.910, below the action level of 1.3; fluoride 1.62 parts per million with a maximum of 4 allowed; and lead, 5 parts per billion, compared with an action level of 15. Iron levels tested at 240 parts per billion, compared with a maximum acceptable level of 1.000. Sodium levels were at 18.

No government standards are set for sodium; however the information is provided for residents who may be on a sodium-restricted diet.

Using the same maximums allowable, Rossville's water tested at 21.5 for arsenic, 0.110 for barium, 0.150 copper and 0.370 fluoride. Iron tested at 1,500, manganese at 31 and sodium at 21.

According to the report, all of the contaminants enter the water supply through erosion of natural deposits. Other causes are discharge from certain types of industrial production. Some contaminants, such as fluoride, are added to water systems, while others, like copper, occur from corroding household plumbing, according to the report.
