## Hoopeston council approves paving West Washington St.

Residents of West Washington St. will have smooth sailing in the near future.

The Hoopeston city council voted 7-1 Tuesday to pave over the brick street from McFerren Park to Second Ave.

Paving the street was discussed at the July 6 meeting but was tabled until the matter could be discussed with the Hoopeston Historical Society.

In a letter to the council, society representatives said the group has no plans or money to maintain the brick streets.

Alderman Bill Goodwine voted against the change,

saying brick streets add character to the city. Also, he said, the council should decide whether to try to keep some brick streets or cover them all.

In other business, the council:

□learned the sewage treatment plant needs a new roof and that the water/sewer department is considering a portable jetting unit rather than a jet truck. The difference could save the city several thousands of dollars, said committee chairman Drew Allen.

Dapproved Paul Eugene Thompson as an auxiliary police officer. Thompson previously served on the auxiliary but left to work as a Rankin officer.

## Rossville officials look at reinstating village property tax

ROSSVILLE— Village officials are considering reinstating property tax to make up a \$150,000 shortfall in the general fund.

At Monday's meeting, trustee Tom Mills, finance committee chairman, suggested reinstating the tax, which was abolished approximately two years ago, said Mayor Merv Smith.

The village saw a \$150,000 deficit, in part due to lost



gas and water revenues and repairs to village equipment and infrastructure.

Mills' suggestion that water rates be increased was shot down by trustee Bill Galloway, water/sewer committee chair.

The tax would come from areas that do not require a referendum, such as taxes on Illinois Municipal Retire-See TAX on other side
