The annual sidewalk sale, scheduled for Aug. 6 and 7, will offer a little something for everyone, said organizer Phyllis Freeland, chairman of the Chamber's promotions committee.

A band, headed by Trent Lockhart, is scheduled to perform and, to keep shoppers cool, the Chamber will be giving away watermelon.

With more than two weeks left until the event, nine sponsoring businesses have already signed on to help promote the sale.

Those sponsors – Weber Drugs, Resale Shop, Countryside, Sewing Boutique, Sheridan's, Global Fashions,

Pamida, Hummingbird Farms and Kankakee Federal Savings & Loan – as well as others that may be added before the sale, will also have tickets available for door prize drawings to be held Aug. 6.

## Community college nursing program approved by state

An associate degree in nursing program at Danville Area Community College has been approved by the Board of Nursing of the Illinois Department of Professional Regulation.

The program will begin this fall in two levels. Level I

is for students entering nursing education. Students who have completed general education classes will be given priority. Applicants must also successfully complete the practical nursing aptitude test. Students who pass Level I may either exit the program, take the practical nurse license test or progress to Level II.

DACC has contracted faculty from Lakeview College of Nursing to teach in Level II, for licensed practical nurses who want to complete an associate degree in nursing. Applicants must document 1,020 hours of nursing employment in the past two years. Prospective students who graduated from an approved practical nursing program more than five years before admission must successfully complete the RN aptitude test.
