Governor signs Myers'-sponsored family farmer support act

A bill designed to help family farmers, sponsored by state Sen. Judy Myers (R-Danville) has been signed into law.

Gov. George Ryan signed Senate Bill 72, the Family Farmer Support Act, which allows family farmers to form cooperatives to produce or market their goods.

"Farmers need our support," Myers said. "In cooperatives, smaller farmers can form groups to get better prices for their crops or livestock and to purchase goods at lower prices. Hopefully, these cooperatives will make individual farmers more competitive and productive."

Under the new law, the University of Illinois will cre-



ate a Cooperative Development Board which will establish, assist and enhance the development of local and regional cooperatives for the benefit of family farmers. The university and the board will provide standardized material about cooperatives for farmers across the state. The bill is effective immediately.

Two other Myers-sponsored bills were also signed into law.

A crime victim and witness notification bill, signed by Ryan last Thursday, will provide a comprehensive notification system comprised of files from throughout the state. The statewide system will download all necessary information from participating officials. The information will then be disseminated by public officials to victims and witnesses, Myers said.

A bill setting statewide consistent standards in addressing domestic violence victims was signed by the governor Friday, Myers said.

Under this law, hospital and nursing home workers will be trained to assess the needs of domestic violence victims, collect and retain materials to be used as evidence, notify appropriate law enforcement and refer victims to agencies providing evaluation and care.
