 Hoopeston Area grade schools have listed supplies students will need for the 1999-00 year. They are:

Early Childhood – 1 box 8 large crayons, 1 box tissues, 2 glue sticks, book bag big enough to hold a folder, complete change of clothes to be left at school.

Kindergarten – 1 box 8 large crayons (first semester) 1 box 16 large crayons (second semester), 4 oz. Bottle Elmer's white glue, 2 primary pencils (large type), paint shirt or apron, supply box (cigar or similar type), 1 large box tissues, pair tennis shoes for P.E. (to be left at school, no black bottoms) 2 large white glue sticks, school bag, 1 pink or green eraser, change of clothes to be kept in child's locker. No paints, scissors, rulers or pencil sharpeners.

First grade -2 pocket folders, 1 pkg. #2 pencils, 1 eraser, 1 box 16 crayons (nothing larger), 8 oz. Bottle white paper glue, 2 glue sticks, child's scissors (metal), 1 box tissues, pencil box, paint shirt, pair gym shoes to be left at school, school bag or equivalent.

Second grade -2 Ross solid glue sticks (not liquid), 8 oz. Bottle Elmer's white paper glue, 2 pink block erasers, 1 box 24 crayons, child's scissors (Fiskars, metal blades w/plastic handle, dull tip) 2 pocket folders (no 3 ring binders) 1 or 2 boxes tissues, 1 pkg. Long colored pencils, pencil box, gym shoes to be left at school, paint shirt, 1 pkg. of 8 wide-tipped markers (no thin tips).

Maple Special Ed – school box, 1 box 16 or 24 crayons, 2 4 oz. Bottles Elmer's glue, 2 glue sticks, 1 box markers (Crayola lasts longer) 1 pkg. #2 pencils, block eraser, pencil sharpener, scissors, 1 pkg. colored pencils, 2 pocket folders, 1 wide-ruled notebook paper theme book, gym shoes to be left at school, pain shirt, 1 box water colors and brushes, 1 pkg. Play Doh, book bag, 2 boxes tissues, change of clothes to be left at school.

Third grade -8 oz. bottle white glue (no glue sticks), gym shoes, school box, spiral notebook, paint shirt, four pocket folders, 1 box tissues, colored pencils, scissors (no plastic ones) plastic ruler with metric and inches, pink block eraser, six #2 pencils, crayons (48 or smaller), watercolor markers, wide-ruled white single sheet notebook paper (no spiral or college-rule), extra red-lead pencil.

Addition and subtraction flashcards are suggested for home use the first semester. Multiplication flashcards are suggested the second semester. No Trapper Keepers.

Fourth grade -8 oz. Bottle glue, 2 glue sticks, pink block eraser, 5 #2 pencils, crayons, gym shoes for inside use only, school box, paint shirt, watercolor markers, 2 boxes tissues, wide-ruled white single sheet notebook paper (no spirals or college-ruled), pointed school scissors, large box colored pencils, 2 extra red-lead pencils, 2 pocket folders, 2 red pens.

Additionally, Mrs. Barnes' students will need 3 wide-line spiral notebooks and Mrs. Sprague's students will need a 3 ring binder/notebook, with rings at least 2" in diameter. Subject dividers are also needed.

Fifth grade – 200 sheets wide-ruled loose leaf paper, 1 200 page wide-lined spiral notebook, 6 pocket folders, 12 #2 pencils, 1 box colored pencils, scissors, 1 drawing-type compass, 1 metric/English ruler, 1 box 24 or more crayons, set of 8 washable Crayola Classic markers, 1 large glue stick, 1 bottle school glue, hand-held pink eraser, white-soled gym shoes, large box tissues, 2 red pencils.
