Police crack down on illegal peddling with four arrests

Door-to-door salesmen who are not properly licensed will be shown to another door – of a jail cell.

That's the message being sent by Hoopeston police, who made four arrests Friday for violations of the peddlers and itinerant merchants ordinance for illegal sales of vacuum cleaners and magazines.

Arrested were Ginger M. Wilson, no age listed, of Rockville, Ind.; Will A. Bumps, 23, of Logansport, Ind.; Ronnie L. Payne II, 24, of Cleveland, Tenn.; and Nor-

man L. Sandlin, 18, of Clearwater, Fla.

All were released on notices to appear.

City ordinance mandates solicitors pay \$25 for a one-day license or \$50 for a yearly license, before peddling their wares in the city. Charitable organizations are exempt from the ordinance.

"It's not a heinous, dangerous crime but it is a nuisance," said Chief Mark Drollinger, adding elderly residents are often the victims of peddlers.

Drollinger thanked residents who reported the incidents and asked that other residents call with future complaints. "This is something we're going to be aggressive on in the future," he said.
