### Rossville residents asked to cooperate with CDAP survey

ROSSVILLE—Residents are being asked to help the village with major projects, such as repairing the sewer or water systems.

But citizens won't need shovels or other tools.

Instead, they are being asked to fill out a survey to determine the percentage of low-income residents in the village.

At a special meeting Thursday, the board met with Tom Mason of the Champaign County Regional Planning Development office and Mark Dwiggens of Upchurch & Associates.

The meeting was held to review suggested infrastructure repairs and learn if the village qualifies for a Community Development Assistance Program (CDAP) grant.

Nearly half of all surveys mailed out earlier this year were not returned, Mason said. Based on those that were received, the village's low-income population stands at about 50 percent.

If the village can show a higher percentage, it

stands a better chance of receiving a grant, Mason said.

The number of low-income residents, as well as possible health or safety violations, are used to determine which communities are accepted into the CDAP program.

Trustee Tom Mills said communities with low-income residents in the 70 percent range get the highest priority, followed by those in the 60s and finally, in the 50s. "We're at the lowest of the low," he said.

Based on the numbers, Mason said the village's chances of getting a grant will be increased if more residents respond.

The surveys will not identify residents by name and the results will not be seen by trustees, Mason said. Residents will mail surveys directly to his office.

In hopes that more residents will respond, village officials may hold off applying for a grant until next




