Corn limit cut in half, quicker lines expected: chairman

A new limit on the number of per-trip ears of corn distributed at this year's National Sweet Corn Festival will be implemented this year.

The 12-ear limit formerly imposed will be cut to six this year, said festival chairman Karen Porth.

Hot, buttered corn, cooked using an old-fashioned steam engine, will be given away Saturday, Sunday and Monday. Last year, some festival-goers stood in line for an hour and a half before receiving their bounty but the six-ear limit is expected to shorten the wait, Porth said.

It is also expected to decrease the amount of corn wasted, more important than ever this year since corn is no longer being donated by Stokely.

The Hoopeston Jaycees, festival sponsor, are buying corn from a Harvard, Ill., grower. Ten tons each will be delivered for Saturday and Sunday consumption with another six tons coming Monday, Porth said.

Thursday marks the 56th festival's opening day, an opening Porth is looking forward to. "I'm ready for it to start, and not because I want it to be over," she said. "We're ready for it."

The only thing Porth now has to worry about is the weather, which can make or break a festival. "My only stressor right now is the rain," she said.
