HA passes "worst case" budget with \$1.1 million deficit

The Hoopeston Area school board on Thursday passed a "worse case scenario" budget with a \$1.1 million defi-

Finance manager Don Dean said he used conservative revenue estimates and liberal expense estimates to arrive at the budget numbers.

A deficit is projected because of a \$45,000 loss in state aid, a \$65,000 decrease in Title I money, a \$30,000 loss in special education funding and losses in other state-funded programs based on fewer students in the district.

The state uses average daily attendance to calculate state aid, which is based on the district's best three

months of attendance.

The district lost 55 students in average daily attendance over last year, Dean said, at a cost of \$4,300 each in state aid. Since 1995, 135 students have left Hoopeston schools.

While looking at the blackest picture to create the budget, Dean said the district will probably have less of a deficit than what is projected. Reserve funds will be used to meet the district's financial obligations.

In other business, the board accepted resignations from Kay Hampton, CARE/HIP aide, and Gretchen Brown, assistant middle school girls track coach. Brown was hired as eighth grade volleyball coach and Adrian Marruffo as assistant middle school girls track coach.
