Co-op school reps to move forward, R-A keeps options open

ROSSVILLE—Representatives of five area school districts want to move more quickly on establishing a cooperative high school but one of those districts is keeping its options open.

Representatives of Armstrong, Armstrong-Ellis, Bismarck, Potomac and Rossville met in Rossville Monday night to discuss a co-op high school.

And while representatives agreed to pursue getting the issue on the March ballot, Rossville-Alvin officials plan to keep lines of communication open with Hoopeston Area.

Rossville-Alvin is needed by the other districts to

make up a 500-student base, needed to meet state requirements for co-op schools, and would also be an asset to the Hoopeston Area district. "We're the prettiest girl at the prom," said Rossville-Alvin superintendent Phil Smith after the meeting, adding the district will continue talks with Hoopeston.

Rossville-Alvin school board president Dennis Price agreed, saying the board must do what is best for the district.

Price admitted he is less enthusiastic about moving

forward with plans for a co-op school because voters need more information to make an informed decision. "I'm afraid that here, if the public is not informed, it will shut this thing down forever," Price said during the meeting. "If people don't know what's going on, there's no way in the world it's going to pass around here."

A 1998 non-binding referendum on a combined school passed in the Rossville-Alvin district by only four votes, he said.

The co-op committee considered information on newly-constructed schools ranging in price from \$11.3 million to \$13.1 million. An additional \$1 million would be needed to purchase a site for the school, with an addi-
