local record will make a good impression on Coles County residents.

Allied Waste, owner of the local landfill, hopes to build a 250 acre facility in Coles County. The company has taken out full page advertisements in the Charleston Times-Courier featuring letters from officials in cities that have dealt with the company.

One of the letters, from Mayor Bob Ault, appeared in the Sept. 2 issue. Ault's letter, addressed to the Coles County clerk, states that Hoopeston has done business with Allied Waste for approximately 10 years, including 1992 when a host agreement between the two parties was signed. "We have found that Allied Waste had honored every item that was agreed upon in the host agreement," Ault's letter said, adding that in other matters between the city and Allied, "they have always been

Alderman John Haughee disagreed with Ault's opinion on Allied Waste's track record. "Referring to pickup of garbage, I have no quarrel with the landfill people," he said, "but I believe they violated the host agreement."

Specifically, Haughee said, one paragraph of the agreement states the company will construct a materials recycling facility (MRF) in Hoopeston.

Since the 1992 document was signed, Allied has purchased additional properties, including a Champaign facility that has a MRF. Local recycled materials are taken to that MRF, according to Paul Beezhold, Vermilion Waste manager.

Despite the proximity to another recycling facility, Haughee maintains that the company agreed to build a See LANDFILL on other side

facility here. "They were going to build a million dollar facility and now they don't have to," Haughee said. "The city lost jobs in that."

Haughee suggested that Allied and city officials should renegotiate the point, with the city receiving at least part of the money that would have been spent building the recycling facility. "There's a building that everybody's clamoring over," he said, referring to requests that the city demolish the White Elephant on North Market. "There are sidewalks in this town that need repair."

Haughee said his difference of opinion is a matter of judgment. "In (Ault's) judgment, he feels they're doing everything they're supposed to be doing. In my judgment, they're not," he said, adding "I'm not wanting an argument, as such."

Ault said the letter was written as a professional courtesy, not a testimonial to expanded landfills. "It's been done many times for other people," he said. "I'm not advocating what they do down there."

Other letters, written by the mayor of East Moline and the president of he Lee County Industrial Development



Association in Dixon, also praised the company.

Whether those letters will be enough to sway Coles County residents to favor a bigger landfill is not known.

According to information provided by Dave Fopay, a Times-Courier reporter, Allied Waste filed an application to site the 250-acre landfill in March 1999. That landfill would replace an existing 60 to 70-acre landfill

which is expected to be full in about two years.

As in siting hearings here, Allied Waste is facing opposition in Coles County, from residents who criticize the projected 10-story height of the landfill, as well as the proposed location.

Fopay said the company's application requests the landfill be sited on a Class A stream. Also, the southwest corner of the proposed site will abut a 10-acre nature preserve, he said.

Technical and legal experts questioned the application, which was withdrawn in June, but company officials are expected to file a new application shortly, he said.
