Chevy, Ford dealers purchase local Chrysler operation

Two Hoopeston car dealers have purchased the city's third dealership and are taking aim at the Danville market.

Dick Read, owner of Read Pontiac, Buick, Oldsmobile, Chevrolet and Dave Bell, owner of Crown Ford, have purchased King Motors, a Chrysler dealership.

Under the deal, the Chrysler shop. Located on Rt. 9, will be called Hoopeston Star Chrysler. Read and Bell will oversee operations, but the each business will be run independently.

The joint venture will allow Bell and Read to "put together an advertising alliance that will allow us to go into the Danville market," Read said.

The owners hope to attract buyers - and additional sales tax money - from Danville and the surrounding area, Read said.

A new advertising logo is being designed to encourage out-of-town car buyers to shop at "the City of Savings" as well as to get new buyers used to something local residents are already familiar with: "the home town atmosphere," Read said.

To do that, the new store is predominantly staffed with

"a lot of Hoopeston people and people who are very familiar with the way a small-town store is run," Read said.

Art Guyan, a Hoopeston newcomer, will manage the store. Guyan has experience as sales manager at a Joliet dealership, Read said.

Chris Cox of Hoopeston will be the service manager, and Terry Flint, also of Hoopeston, is the parts manager. Randy Carter, a Hoopeston resident, will lead the sales team, which also includes Lori Hickman of Watseka.

Besides giving the owners additional money to use in advertising, the purchase will also give the owners more buying power. The new and used vehicle inventory is expected to increase in the near future.

Both Bell and Read have a long local history in the car business. Bell has owned Crown Ford since 1980, Read said, adding his own experience dates back to working for his father, the late W.A. Read. The senior Read started his business in 1956. "We have a long lineage in the auto business," Read said.

The deal, which closed Friday, has been in the works "a while," Read said.
