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Sparks fly over proposed site of new Rossville fire station

ROSSVILLE—Construction of a new fire station has turned into a hot topic in Rossville.

The fire protection district and fire department hope to purchase three acres in the Morts and Mann subdivision on Route 1.

Officials met with the village zoning board of appeals Thursday, hoping to have the property zoned from residential to commercial, allowing them to build a new station.

The zoning board tabled the request pending a decision from village attorney Steve Miller of Acton and Snyder, Danville, as to whether a special use permit may be issued rather than rezoning the property, said zoning committee chairman Gene Roach.

The request is not without opposition, Roach said. "A few-but not all-adjacent property owners object to it," he said. "They're concerned it will open the door to further rezoning along Route 1."

he zoning board had hoped to meet again Jan. 27 but Roach said all the necessary information will not be available in time. The meeting has been postponed indefinitely.

Although fire officials hope to have the property rezoned and purchase it in the near future, constructing a

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fire station is approximately two years in the future, said Rossville Fire Chief Lloyd Smith.

Before construction begins, fire officials must first complete payments on a fire truck. When the truck is paid for, the fire district may then take on mortgage payments.

Before the fire district takes on mortgage payments, they will first try to get a state grant to pay for construction. Smith said.

A new site for a fire station has been considered for about three years, he said. Officials looked in the downtown area but were unable to find property large enough. Areas south of town were also considered but were not for sale. Smith said.

The property currently being considered is large enough to allow access from all sides and include landscaping to "shield it from the neighbors," he said.

Smith admitted some residents of adjacent property are against a fire station in their neighborhood. "It seems like some of them are fighting it tooth and toenail," he said.

Concerns include decreased property values, the potential danger of fire trucks running past Rossville-Alvin schools and increased property taxes. However, he said, the new fire station "will not be a metal pole building but something that will fit right into the neighborhood."

As for posing a threat to students, Smith said 88 percent of department calls are after school hours or on weekends. "We try not to be flying by the schools even in an emergency situation," he said.

Smith does not expect tax rates to increase. Currently, he said, the owner of a \$100,000 home pays approximately \$28 for fire protection. That amount is offset in many instances by lower insurance premiums based on See STATION on other side


