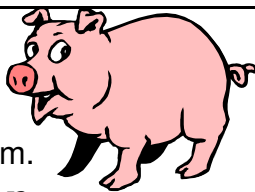

Danville chiropractors open Hoopeston satellite office

A Danville chiropractic office has opened a satellite office in Hoopeston.

Drs. Duke Oxendine and Nathalie Pelletier have opened Family Chiropractic Health Clinic in Dr. William Andrews' office at 628 W. Maple.

The husband and wife team started their Danville practice two years ago. They decided to expand to Hoopeston because of patient requests, Dr. Oxendine said.

Dr. Oxendine, of Davenport, Iowa, and Dr. Pelletier, of Quebec, attended Palmer College in Davenport, where their education included training in all available methods of chiropractics.

Along with traditional manual manipulation, the practice also offers "the whole gamut" of services from rehabilitation to massage. The rehabilitation portion is especially beneficial to laborers and farmers who are

"looking to rejuvenate themselves so they can get back to work," Dr. Oxendine said.

The couple also offers exercise rehabilitation classes at their Danville office.

Dr. Oxendine found chiropractics after working as a certified athletic trainer at the University of North Carolina. While there, he developed his own techniques and decided to study chiropractics.

Dr. Pelletier attended the University of Laval in Quebec prior to graduating from Palmer.

The two toured Vermilion County before opening their Danville practice and "fell in love with the area," Dr. Oxendine said.
