Hoopeston Area schools to lose seasoned teachers this year

Hoopeston Area schools will lose 180 years of teaching experience this year.

At Thursday's meeting, the board approved resignations from first grade teacher Julie Hughes with 36 years' experience; athletic director Jim Matta with 38 years' experience; Quentin Ryder, high school social studies teacher, coach and class sponsor, with 35 years' experience; and Lawrence Jahn, teacher and technology coordinator, with 36 years' experience.

In related action, the board also approved resignations from Mike Penicook, eighth grade boys basketball coach and Pete Sollars, varsity boys basketball coach.

In other action, the board approved a 10-cent increase in lunch prices for the 2000-01 year. Elementary lunches will cost \$1.50, high school lunches \$1.60 and adult lunches \$2. Superintendent Mark Conolly explained the food service department cannot make a profit over a three-year period. "The 10 cents just makes sure we don't lose as much," he said.

Board president Larry Lobb noted more students appear to be eating school lunches, which Conolly

credited to food service supervisor Brenda Cruisenberry. "She's done a good job," he said.

In unrelated business, the board:

- approved a 160-acre land trade with the Milford school districts.

If the trade is approved by the Milford boards and the Vermilion and Iroquois-Kankakee Regional Offices of Education, Hoopeston Area will gain four students and Milford three.

A hearing on the trade is expected to be held during the summer.

- heard from Jahn and network administrator James Eyrich about recent improvements in the district's technology program.

- learned the district received an \$8,000 Ameren-CIPS grant to develop land for soccer and practice fields. Grounds superintendent Ron Lewis presented three scenarios for developing the property east of the existing baseball and football fields.

- approved requesting a five-year modification from the state allowing the district to commemorate Presidents' Day rather than Lincoln's birthday.

- approved a two-year extension of the county calendar, taking the district through the 2003 school year.

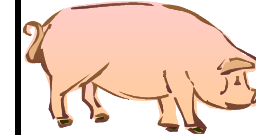

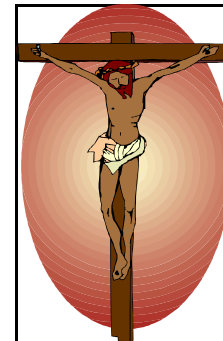
