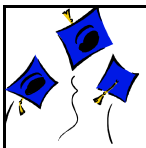

### Hoopeston Area board hopes to cut district grocery bills

Like area families, the Hoopeston Area school board looks at ways to save money on its grocery bill. On Thursday, the board approved a plan that is expected to do just that.

The board unanimously approved a one-year membership in the LaSalle county Area Purchasing Co-op, an organization that purchases and delivers food to members.

"They do what we do normally," said Superintendent Mark Conolly. The co-op deals with vendors, makes decisions on purchases and passes the savings on to members.

"They're telling us we can save ten to 15 percent a year in costs," Conolly said, adding more savings will be realized through time saved dealing with vendors.

The district will still have to purchase bread and milk from area vendors, said food service manager Brenda Crusinberry. She will be able to place orders on-line and have items delivered once a week.

Membership in the cooperative is based on attendance. The first year, the cost will be \$1.85 per student, which will cost the district approximately \$2,700, Conolly said. For subsequent years, the fee will be 85 cents per stu-

dent or roughly \$1,200.

In unrelated business, the board learned the land development plan has taken another step forward.

The district purchased 6.3 acres behind the high school, adjacent to the Grant Township property. A check for the property was written this week and Conolly expects to have title to the land next week.

The ground will be used for soccer and practice fields, but it will take some time before students are able to use them. "It's a two or three year project, maybe longer," Conolly said. "When we put in the new baseball field about 10 years ago, that took three years."

The district received an AmerenCIPS landscaping grant that will defray some of the costs of developing the land. The buildings and grounds committee will meet with landscapers to develop plans and make a recommendation to the full board.

The first three things to be done to the property are installing water lines, grading the land and installing tiles for drainage, said board president Larry Lobb.

In other action, the board learned the district qualified for a second class size reduction grant. The money will be used at Maple School

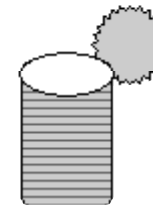
