





Library board signs contract with architect for addition

A Champaign architect has been selected to design an addition to the Hoopeston Public Library.

Gary Olson of Olson and Associates was selected as the project architect and signed a contract with library board on June 12, said head librarian Lou Graham.

Olson will consider the existing structure, Americans with Disabilities Act requirements, potential cost and Illinois State Library standards in his design, Graham said.

Olson was selected after the board "interviewed some wonderful people," Graham said, adding Olson had the most experience with the Illinois grant process and Carnegie libraries.

Preliminary drawings of the addition will include an elevator that will allow all patrons access to library materials. "They won't be denied access to any

part of the building or any collection," Graham said. The addition will also include a meeting room, rest rooms and entry way, all handicapped-accessible.

Some work is also planned for the existing library, including widening shelving areas to allow patrons with walkers or wheelchairs to move through the library more easily, Graham said. Because spaces between shelves will be widened, more shelves are expected to be added. "We buy a lot and you have to have a place to put it," Graham said.

The cost of the addition and renovations will be based on the preliminary designs. Money for the project will come primarily from the Charlotte Russell and Wilson Farwell Bessellieu trusts. The library may also have to seek additional funding for the project.

DACC Foundation to award second round of scholarships

DANVILLE—For the first time in its 34-year history, the Danville Area Community College Foundation will award a second round of scholarships prior to the beginning of the fall semester.

In May, the DACC Foundation awarded more than 100 scholarships to area students. Beginning July 3, applications will be accepted for more than 25 foundation scholarships.

The deadline to apply is Monday, July 31. Completed applications must be returned to the DACC Foundation, Vermilion Hall—Room 222, 2000 E. Main St., Danville, IL 61832.

Those selected will be notified by mail by Aug. 10.



The library board has spent more than a year developing a wish list of things to be included in the project, based on Illinois State Library standards. In fact, those standards suggest that libraries first consider the types of services they wish to offer. A state library book "tells you how much you should set aside for every area of service you want to provide," Graham said.

To commemorate the board's efforts, a plaque listing their names will be placed in the new addition. Similar plaques hang in the original 1904 building and 1975 section, Graham said.

Groundbreaking for the project is expected to begin next year.
