

## Candidates courting circuit clerk's job speak at meeting

Two women vying to be Vermilion County's circuit clerk spoke of their qualifications at Monday's Hoopeston Neighborhood Watch meeting.

Republican Susan Ponder Miller, who currently holds the position, and challenger Leigh Busby Hughes have spent several years working in the circuit clerk's office.

The circuit clerk is responsible for all court records and files and collecting fees and fines. A member of the clerk's office also attends court sessions

Busby-Hughes, worked in the office until 1986. when she left to enter the banking industry. She returned as a deputy clerk in 1992.

Busby-Hughes stressed her community activism, including 12 years in Danville community theater

and membership in the Legal Secretaries of Vermilion County, Business and Professional Women, Boys and Girls Club and Bib Brothers/Big Sisters.

"In my opinion, serving the public is the number one (aspect of) this position," Busby-Hughes said. "I've learned to appreciate the emotional aspects of this position."

Ponder-Miller has worked in the circuit clerk's office for 23 years. Six years ago, she was promoted to supervisor of the traffic/misdemeanor department and was named to head the office May 1.

"Hoopeston really has a growing case load," she said, adding court for state offenses is held one morning each month but that may have to be ex-

Official team check-in will be 9-10 a.m. Saturday with round 1 preliminary competition beginning at 10. Teams are scheduled in divisions according to age and class.

Men's divisions include junior high (grades 6-8); junior/senior, freshman/sophomore; open 18-34; nostalgia 35 and up. Women's divisions include junior high (6-8th grades), junior/senior; freshman/sophomore; and open 18 and older.

Each team will consist of three players. Alternates can be recruited on the spot in case of injury, illness or emergency only.

tended to accommodate the need

Ponder-Miller said she has worked to implement new programs to save taxpayer money. One such program is the addition of a service allowing credit cards to be used to pay bond. An Indianapolis, Ind., company will provide the service at no cost to the county, she said. People using credit cards will be charged a fee for the service, she added.

She is working with Sheriff Pat Hartshorn on the change, which is expected to become effective Aug. 1.

Ponder-Miller and Busby-Hughes both support using credit cards as a means of cutting down some backlog in the system, but both see drawbacks.

For Busby-Hughes, the largest drawback is that those posting the bond may not realize the money may not be returned. For example, if someone posts bond for a prisoner, the money may be used for other offenses pending against that person, she said. "The people posting the bond need to know that."

For Ponder-Miller, a drawback is that people will think the system is even easier for those charged with crimes. "It might look like we've made it too easy but people can go to the bank and get money," she said.

The appearance of the women is the second in a series featuring candidates in the November election. The Aug. 7 meeting is expected to feature judge candidates Dave Ryan and Craig DeArmond.
