ROSSVILLE—Danville attorney Tim Smith will hear from both sides of a request to rezone part of North Chicago Street for a fire station.

The Rossville village board approved using a single hearing officer who will then make a recommendation to the board.

The proposed location for the fire station has drawn ire from some residents. The fire district had at first asked that the property be rezoned from R-1 residential to commercial. The district then asked for a special use permit to construct the station. Both were refused.

Last month, the village board appointed a special zoning committee to hear the request but a legal challenge was mounted against the committee, said Mayor Merv Smith.

The hearing may not be held less than 15 nor more than 30 days from Monday night, Smith said, suggesting it may be held Aug. 8.

In unrelated business, the mayor's salary may be rising significantly.

Trustee Tom Mills asked the board to consider raising the mayor's salary from a few hundred dollars a year to \$25,000 to \$30,000.

The board had discussed hiring a city manager but Mills said none are to be found. Most managerial graduates are from Naperville or Crystal Lake. "I don't think they'd fit in Rossville, he said"

The April 2001 election will provide "basically a new administration and it might be a good idea if we start fresh," Mills said.

In other business, trustees learned full time police officer Chris Coon resigned effective July 23. The health and safety committee is accepting applications for one full time and two part time officers, said committee chairman Dick Hall.

Services set for long-time Rossville resident Pansy Poland

ROSSVILLE—An icon in the Rossville community has died.

Pansy Fisher Poland, 103, died at 7:20 a.m. Sunday, July 16, 2000 at Hoopeston Community Memorial Hospital.

Mrs. Poland was born Oct. 2, 1896 near Needham, Ind., the daughter of Jacob and Iona Alexander Fisher. She graduated from Fairland High School in 1916 and attended both Franklin College and Indiana University. She married Raymond Poland on June 18, 1918 and they began their life as educators.

Mrs. Poland began teaching one room schools and ended her teaching career in the Rossville schools, where her husband was a longtime school superintendent.

She and her husband had one son, "Hobie," who died in 1945 as a much-decorated WWII hero. She was also preceded in death by her husband.
