## Hoopeston Area lists needed 2000-01 school supplies

Hoopeston Area grade schools have listed supplies students will need for the 1999-00 year. They are:

**Early Childhood** – 1 box 8 large crayons, 1 box tissues, 2 glue sticks, book bag big enough to hold a folder, complete change of clothes to be left at school.

**Kindergarten** – 1 box 8 large Crayola crayons (first semester) 1 box 16 large Crayola crayons (second semester), 2 4 oz. bottles Elmer's white glue, 2 primary pencils (large type), paint shirt or apron, supply box (cigar or similar type), 1 large box tissues, pair tennis shoes for P.E. (to be left at school, no black bottoms) 4 white glue sticks, school bag, 1 pink or green eraser, change of clothes to be kept in child's locker.

**Primary Special Ed** – school box, 1 box 24 crayons, 1 bottle Elmer's glue gel, 4 glue sticks, 1 box markers (Crayola lasts longer) block eraser, scissors, 1 pkg. colored pencils, 2 pocket folders, gym shoes to be left at school, paint shirt, 1 pkg. Play Doh, book bag, 2 boxes tissues, change of clothes to be left at school.

**First grade** – 3 pocket folders, 2 pkgs. #2 pencils, 2 erasers, pink block rectangular type, 1 box each 8 and 16 crayons, 8 oz. bottle white paper glue, 2 glue sticks, child's scissors (metal), 1 box tissues, pencil box, paint shirt, pair gym shoes to be left at school, school bag.

**Second grade** – 2 Ross solid glue sticks, 8 oz. bottle Elmer's white paper glue, 2 pink block erasers, 1 box 24 crayons, child's scissors (Fiskars, metal blades) 2 pocket folders 1 or 2

boxes tissues, 1 pkg. long colored pencils, pencil box, gym shoes to be left at school, paint shirt, 1 pkg. of 8 wide-tipped markers.

**Third grade** – 8 oz. bottle white glue, 2 glue sticks, gym shoes, paint shirt, 5 pocket folders, 1 box tissues, colored pencils, scissors (Fiskars preferred) plastic ruler with metric and inches, pink block eraser, six #2 pencils, crayons (48 or smaller), washable markers, wide-ruled white single sheet notebook paper (no spiral), extra red-lead pencil. No Trapper Keepers.

**Fourth grade** – 8 oz. bottle glue, 2 glue sticks, pink block eraser, 5 #2 pencils, crayons, gym shoes for inside use only, school box, paint shirt, watercolor markers, 2 boxes tissues, wide-ruled white single sheet notebook paper (no spiral), pointed school scissors, large box colored pencils, 2 extra red-lead pencils, 3 pocket folders, 2 red pens, 1 3 ring binder notebook (rings at least 2" w/subject dividers). No Trapper Keepers.

**Fifth grade** – 200 sheets wide-ruled loose leaf paper, 2 wide-lined spiral notebooks (50-70 sheets), 6 pocket folders, 12 #2 pencils, hand-held pink eraser, white-soled gym shoes, large box tissues, 2 red pencils, 1 highlighter.

Additional art supplies include 4 pencils, scissors, 1 ruler (metric/English), 1 box 24 or more crayons, 1 set of 8 washable Crayola Classic markers, 1 Stanford Sharpie fine point black
